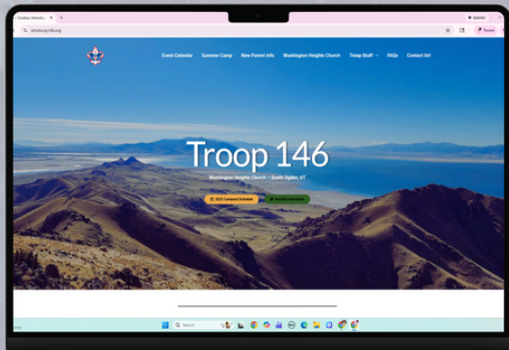
More details to come, but be sure to save the dates—this will be a great way to start spring break with Troop 146!
